The Man, Who Came to Jesus.

This story, in Mark 10:17-31, tells of a man, who approached Jesus and asked him how he could have eternal life. It is a reminder that even very good people can have a view of life which is distorted by their lifestyle. We learn, by putting together the parallel accounts in Matthew and Luke, that this man was a ruler, that he was rich, that he had his whole life ahead of him (he was young) and that he had lived a very good life, keeping all of the Ten Commandments. Jesus likes him, but knows where the weakness lies in his dedication to God. He

Jesus likes him, but knows where the weakness lies in his dedication to God. He encourages the young man to give away his riches to follow him.

In those moments the young man glimpses eternity, but he also sees the cost. His life would be turned upside down!

And he goes away... sad.

The average Australian today probably has more stuff, more luxuries, more distractions than that young man had, so the challenge to follow Jesus is just as great -- and the cost of not following, every bit as sad.

Jesus went on to reassure his disciples that those who gave up everything to follow him, would gain far more than they lost, in other ways!

And I know this is true.
